When I was a kid, my mother had *Town & Country* around the house, and I was taken with all the jewelry in it, and how you take geodes and stones and make gems out of them. In 2016, I started making this fish bracelet that was inspired by a brooch my mother had, and a friend wore it as her 'something borrowed' at her wedding. I started my company in January 2017 and am completing Gemological Institute of America courses. I want clients to feel they're getting something of real value. I'm now working on some more gold designs that people can wear every day."
